The Friends was formed by a group of dedicated library patrons who were committed to finding a new location for the Collbran Branch Library. The Friends were instrumental in finding the library's current home in the Stockmens' Bank Building at 111 Main Street in Collbran and Friends

The Stockmens' Bank Building, which was built in 1929, and now houses the Collbran Branch Library and its collection of books.
